The Student Council then created a special whatsapp group for all the candidates and shared various documents which provided basic understanding, functioning, rules and procedures of the NYPS with the candidates.

Training to the Candidates

In the training sessions the candidates were explained about Do's and Don'ts in the Youth Parliament which was shared by the Ministry to the college.

All the candidates were given a week's time to know, understand the Parliamentary procedures, rules, and it's functions. The candidates were advised to watch real Parliament sessions, so that they get a brief understanding about the functioning of the Parliament. The candidates were also advised to watch the youtube recordings of National Youth Parliaments and sample videos provided by the Ministry were also shared. The candidates were also taught about the proper dressing for the Youth Parliament.

After this process from 21.11.2022 and 24.11.2022, online & offline training sessions were held under the guidance of Teacher-in-Charge, Prof Vinita Sharma. In the training session the candidates were provided with a detailed script of the event. The candidates also got special training on usage of "Parliamentary Language"

The candidates were taught about the procedures of the list of businesses which were going to be taken up in the NYP, and a proper script which was approved by the Teacher-in-Charge was provided. They were also taught how to speak and articulate in the Parliament.

Mock sessions

Mock sessions for the Candidates were conducted on 24.11.2022 & 25.11.2022 for the under the supervision of the Teacher-in-Charge & IQAC Coordinator. The mistakes which were made by the candidates were identified and proper corrections were made.

After the mock sessions, the candidates were confident about their performance for the main Youth Parliament.

The Student Council made ample preparations for the main Youth Parliament on 26.11.2022. The college invited **Shri. Konda Vishweshwar Reddy**, Ex- MP, Chevella, R.R. District, to be Chief Guest for Youth Parliament.

A youtube link of the main event was created and was shared with the candidates, staff, and other audience members. A meeting was also held on 25.11.2022 called by the Principal, which reviewed the preparedness for the event. In the meeting the proposal for planting a sapling in the honour of Chief Guest which would be named as "NYPS TREE" was approved unanimously. The Student Council was appreciated by the meeting for Successfully organizing the training and mock sessions for the Candidates.

The National Youth Parliament 26. 11. 2022

On 26.11.2022 the A.V. NATIONAL YOUTH PARLIAMENT was conducted offline/Physically in the Library hall situated in college premises

Principal Dr. Ch. Rajalingam made the opening address to the Youth Parliament. He said that the aim of the youth parliament is to strengthen the roots of democracy, inculcate healthy habits of discipline, tolerance of the views of others and to enable the student community to understand the working of our Parliamentary institutions. The Principal extended his thanks to the Ministry on behalf of the entire college for approving A.V. College Of Arts, Science and Commerce for conducting National Youth Parliament. The Principal also applauded the A.V. Student Council for Successfully Organizing the event. The Teacher-in-Charge, Prof.Vinitha Sharma explained the impact and importance of conducting National Youth Parliaments.

The IQAC Coordinator Asst.Prof. M. Vidyulatha, explained to the staff, audience members about the National Youth Parliament Scheme, under Ministry Of Parliamentary Affairs. The Coordinator explained about the benefits of the scheme for students and also stressed upon the NEP & NYPS.

The Chief Guest Shri. Konda Vishweshwar Reddy garu, made their opening remarks and told the importance of opposition in the Parliament. He said,

" The floor of the house is not for the government but for the opposition, so that the voice of the people could be heard. After their remarks the Chief Guest declared the Parliament Open.

The Proceedings of the House began ;

Summary of the Proceedings of the House

- 1. The house first administered the oath to the MP, MR. B. Vamshi.
- 2. Then the house paid rich tributes to Shri. G. Krishna (Cinema Actor) under the obituary reference.
- 3. The PM introduced his new Council of Ministers, Ms. K. Sree Vidya, Minister of Jal Shakthi and Mr. M. Yashwanth, Minister of Railways.
- 4. The house then took the Question hour where members asked different questions relating to different ministries.
- The house next took up the Calling Attention Motion on Situation Climate Change in the world and regarding COP27, in the country, moved by MS. Samreen and MR. C. Avish
- 6. The Minister MS. Sanjana Bharti made a statement in the House to the Calling Attention Motion and explained the various steps taken by the government in handling Climate change & COP27.
- The Deputy Speaker, MR. Krishna Teja welcomed Foreign delegate Mr. CH.Rushikesh, Speaker of the Parliament of Nepal and his Delegation, and Dr. Mohd. Shahrukh Ambassador of the United Arab Emirates . The House welcomed them with thumping.
- 8. The Speaker, MR. Mihira Bharadwaj rejected the adjournment motion.
- 9. The house then took up the Legislative Business and the government came up with the The Entrepreneurship Bill 2022, which aims to introduce, strengthen and promote entrepreneurial education in India. The discussion took place on the bill members from Opposition and Treasury

spoke on the bill and expressed their views and the discussion was around "INCENTIVES OF THE ENTREPRENEURS."

- 10. The bill was passed by simple majority.
- 11. The House then took up the short discussion on Metaverse Regulation.
- 12. Many valuable points from opposition were raised and the "Privacy of citizens was stressed."
- 13. The Prime Minister gave the reply stating that the government will take all necessary steps to ensure the security and Privacy of the citizens.
- 14. The House then took up the Private Member Resolution on Electoral Reforms in India, moved by MR. Mahesh Naidu, who was supported by his colleague MP, MR. P.Tharun Kumar. explained the impact of Electoral reforms and demanded the govt to immediately take up the policy which will help voters. The Minister of Home Affairs gave a reply and highlighted the measures of the government and explained to the house about the various schemes of the government which are voter oriented. And assured the member about the policy and requested the member to withdraw the resolution. The member was happy with the minister's reply and withdrew the resolution with the leave of the house.
- 15. The Speaker MR. Mihira Bharadwaj adjourned the house for the next day.

Chief Guest Remarks

The chief Guest after watching the proceedings of the house was very impressed and made the following remarks:

" It was held in impeccable manner, all procedures were followed, I once again congratulate the organizers and the candidates who participated were all well prepared".
